

# **Internship in the Cultural Department of Goethe-Zentrum Kampala/Ugandan German Cultural Society**

## **June – August 2019**

The Ugandan German Cultural Society was founded in 1989, with the major aim of strengthening and promoting the growth of bilateral co-operations between the people of Uganda and Germany and to promote the local art scene. Since 2006, the organization has been an official cooperation partner of the Goethe-Institut. We carry out numerous cultural activities and offer German classes on the six levels of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. From June to August 2019 we are looking for an intern in our cultural department. The internship is not paid and Goethe-Zentrum Kampala does not take over costs for accommodation, flight, visum, insurances and vaccines.

### **Areas of Work during the Internship**

- Participation in the planning, coordination and implementation of cultural projects and events in the fields of literature, visual arts, film and media, music, dance and theater
- Social media and communication
- Dialogue and exchange between German and Ugandan artists
- Research tasks and writing of reports
- Documentation of cultural events
- Guest management

- Very good English language skills (B1 or higher)
- Good knowledge of Microsoft Office (Word, Excel)
- Knowledge of Adobe InDesign and Photoshop
